Technos International Week 2023 Report – Jamil Hasan

Being given the chance to travel to Japan for two weeks and experience the culture first hand from students in Japan was an amazing experience. This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity will be something that I remember forever and will forever keep close to one of the most amazing few weeks that I have ever experienced. The rich culture, the diverse and delicious food, the breath-taking landscapes, and the unique way of life is definitely something that I would strongly recommend to anyone considering visiting Asia. I've been incredibly fortunate to have been able to participate in the Technos International Week at the end of my last term at Oxford, and I could not be evermore grateful to Pembroke, Technos College, Nancy, Matt, and the lifelong friends I made in this trip.

Filled with both excitement and apprehension, myself and the other Pembroke students embarked on a 15-hour journey from Europe to Japan. The overarching theme of the two-week Technos International Week was "Values." With this theme in mind, all participants were encouraged to contribute fully and embrace the opportunities presented to us. The carefully scheduled activities included educational and fun experiences, fostering integration and interaction among the participating sister schools. Ample free time was also provided, allowing us to explore Tokyo's various districts and savour the delicious regional cuisine.

Many of the activities took place at Technos College, where we had the opportunity to tour the campus and participate in interactive sessions with students from various classes. Technos College, a technical institution offering vocational courses such as wedding planning, air crew training, hotel management, manga, voice dubbing, and animation, presented a stark contrast to our academic experiences in Europe. One memorable activity involved an Origami class where the students showed us how to make ninja stars. As someone who used to make this as a child, it was my shine to shine also. It was a fun and interactive event where we shared our different origami knowledge and could show our appreciation for the wonderful art that Origami is. Our stay at Midori No Mura was a true delight, as we were provided with exceptional facilities, including a gymnasium and tennis courts, and enjoyed a variety of activities and entertainment. From playing dodgeball and basketball to engaging in a water fight and a barbecue, we immersed ourselves in the spirit of camaraderie. En route back to Tokyo, we made a stop at a Miso production factory, where we received a unique walkthrough of how a 6th generation Miso producer makes his 3-year Miso.

During our free time, we ventured into various districts of Tokyo and savored a diverse array of delicacies. Shibuya impressed us with its colossal, brightly lit billboards and bustling streets, particularly the iconic Shibuya Crossing, Shinjuku offered a contrast with its quaint, authentic backstreet restaurants, and Asakusa enchanted us with its beautiful Senso-Ji shrine. The Marunouchi district's blend of the Imperial Palace and immaculately clean skyscrapers showcased remarkable architecture. One of my favourite visits was to the Mori Art Museum where I was able to explore the rich art which blended in an interesting way with Japan's history. Throughout our explorations, we indulged in a colourful variety of Japanese cuisine, including sushi, ramen, udon, A5 Wagu, and okonomiyaki.
